



AMENDMENT No.2 – NOTICE OF RACE - NORMANDY CHANNEL RACE

ADD THE FOLLOWING APPENDIX 3:

HEALTH MEASURES NORMANDY CHANNEL RACE 2020

1. Arrangements on shore.

Due to the health context, the following measures will be put in place from Monday 7 to Monday 21 September:

- The wearing of a mask is compulsory at all times across the entire event zone in Caen and Ouistreham, whether it be in the general public village on Quai Venduvre, the reception areas on Quai François Mitterrand, the organisation's offices in the Pavillon or the harbour area in Ouistreham.
- Groups of more than a few people, from the public to racers to organisation, must be avoided when social distancing measures (1m) cannot be adhered to.
- The press conference on Thursday 10 September and the start and safety briefing on Saturday 12 September must be attended with everyone wearing a mask. Where possible, participants must spread themselves out across the whole space, leaving room between those attending the event.
- When following the race start on Sunday 13 September, guests aboard the accompanying passenger vessels must wear a mask throughout the operation.

Hand sanitising gel will be available at the entrances to the general public village, the Carré des Skippers and the organisation's offices at the Pavillon.

2. Measures aboard the boats both dockside and at sea.

The skippers and shore crew who are aboard the Class40 dockside will be able to work on their boats without wearing a mask provided that no more than 2 people are aboard at any one time.

It is not compulsory for skippers to wear a mask at sea during the official duration of the race.

In the event that Covid-19 symptoms are displayed aboard a boat during the race, the skipper must immediately report this to Race Director, who will decide on the appropriate measures following medical advice, which may lead to the crew being forced to retire from the race.

Competitors and accompanying persons must comply with all reasonable requests made by an official working for the event. Failure to comply may constitute misconduct. [DP]

Failure to comply with these measures by those participating in the event may be the subject of a report drawn up by the Organising Authority and Race Management with the International Jury.

Reasonable actions taken by the event managers to implement the COVID-19 guidelines, protocols or legislation, even if they later prove unnecessary, shall not be deemed inadequate actions or omissions.
